





Students meeting state grade-level expectations.




MATHEMATICS







BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

We have implemented a Behavior Support Framework based on three programs: Positive Behavior and Supports (PBIS), a Culture of Care (CoC), and a Social/Emotional learning framework called RULER. These three systems work together to pre-teach expectations around safety, respect, and responsibility, and ensure trauma-informed practices and routines are calibrated and implemented.
