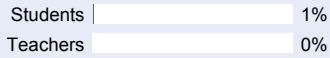

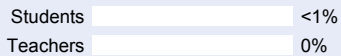

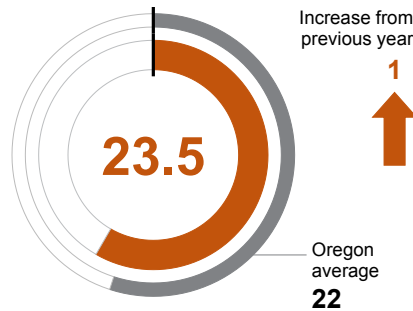

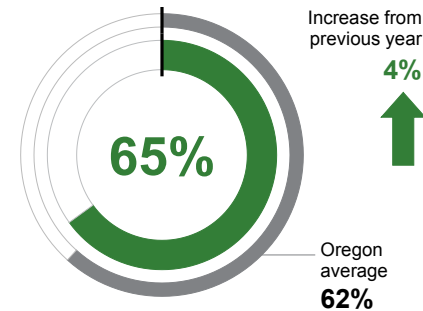
CLASS SIZE

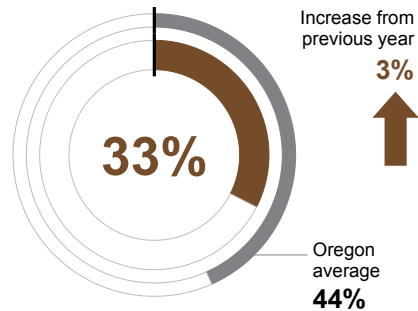

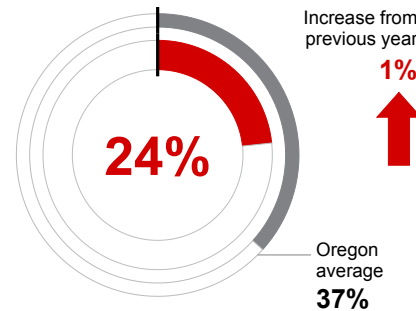
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



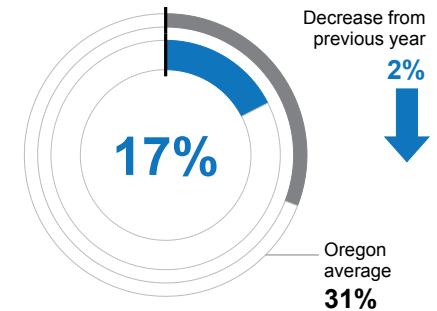
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

We have implemented a Behavior Support Framework based on three programs: Positive Behavior and Supports (PBIS), a Culture of Care (CoC), and a Social/Emotional learning framework called RULER. These three systems work together to pre-teach expectations around safety, respect, and responsibility, and ensure trauma-informed practices and routines are calibrated and implemented. These programs focus on positive outcomes and have helped to build a solid school community at North Marion Intermediate School. Additionally, our school and district participate in the Safe Oregon program to help students feel safe while at school and at home.
