

HEALTHY AND SAFE SCHOOLS PLAN

Introduction

In 2017, the Oregon State Legislature passed SB 1062, which requires that, every school district, education service district, and public charter school develop a Healthy and Safe Schools Plan (HASS Plan). Each organization's HASS Plan has specific requirements that must be included for the HASS Plan to comply with state law. North Marion School District's Healthy & Safe Schools Plan is in compliance and meets the requirements of OAR 581-022-2223. Below is a plan for **North Marion School District 15** to meet the requirement of SB 1062.

3. Elevated Levels of Lead in Water Used for Drinking or Food Preparation

All school districts, education service districts, and public charter schools are required to test for and eliminate exposure to elevated levels of lead in water used for Drinking and Food Preparation through either remediation or eliminating access, according to OAR 333-061-0400 and OAR 581-022-223. In conformance with those administrative rules, North Marion School District has developed a plan that meets the requests of The Oregon Department of Education and the Oregon Health Authority.

A plan has been developed for North Marion School District 15 that certifies the following:

- Identify sources of lead following the EPA 3 T's technical guidance; Stop access; Communicate; Mitigate and correct; continued Monitoring. Community members can access a copy of The EPA's 3Ts technical guidance here: https://www.epa.gov/ground-water-and-drinking-water-dolkit
- 2. All testing was done according to the testing requirements in OAR 333-061-0400;
- 3. All samples were analyzed by a lab accredited by Oregon Health Authority to test for those materials;
- 4. All water fixtures required to be tested under OAR 333-061-0400 were tested for elevated levels of lead in accordance with the testing schedule developed by the Oregon Health Authority; and
- 5. The testing schedule for each building covered by this plan is set forth below:

4. Lead Paint

OAR 581-022-2223 (5) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools plan must include a plan to reduce exposure to lead paint that includes the following compliance with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule. In order to comply with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule, North Marion School District 15 will only contract with certified lead based paint renovation contractors licensed by the Oregon Construction Contractors Board.

5. Asbestos

All Facilities in the North Marion School District 15 comply with the federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA). All required asbestos management plans are available for viewing by submitting a request to David Shultz.

6. Radon

7. Integrated Pest Management

North Marion School District 15 has adopted an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) plan model after the OSU School IPM Program) as required by ORS 634.700 through 634.750. An OSU faculty member with expertise in pesticide toxicology has reviewed all of the pesticides that we use, and they meet the requirements of a "low-impact pesticide" as defined in ORS 634.705 (5). They NEVER have a label category that is higher than Caution, and contain no known carcinogens.

In addition, our custodial, kitchen, maintenance/facilities staff have completed IPM safe school modules, and are eliminating pests through sanitation, organizing, monitoring, and inspections of our environment. In addition, our teaching and support staff have also been educated on how they can help. We are sealing up our buildings, eliminating clutter, keeping food in plastic storage containers, eliminating leaks and drips in our plumbing, properly pruning our landscaping, and being more thorough in our cleaning efforts. Through these efforts, we are eliminating the things that pests need to survive. We are also providing a healthier learning environment for your children, and saving the school district money by reducing costs, workload and less pesticide use. 8. Carbon Monoxide Detectors

North Marion School District 15 certifies that all buildings subject to the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan comply with the carbon monoxide detection standards in the state building code that was in effect when the building was originally constructed or as required by building code due to addition, upgrade, or remodel.

North Marion School District 15 is complying with the requirement to provide access to test results, as defined by OAR 581-022-2223 within 10 business days as defined by ORS 332-334.
